Conference Recap

April 20-22, 2022

Conference was held from April 20-22 in Lake Tahoe. Tahoe had been experiencing a mild weather period, which of course meant that two feet of snow dumped midway through our stay, making Conference more of an adventure than we could have imagined! Wednesday morning opened with a short course by lawyers Ji Shin and Terry Scanlan on contracts (pictured above) and a short course by Mike Holloway, PhD, PE, on engineering pile designs.



That afternoon, the weather was beautiful as we packed the bus for a field trip sponsored by <u>Keller</u> and featuring local geology expert Richard Schweickert, PhD, Emeritus Professor at UNR.

...and chatted with our many exhibitors...




...not unlike their professional counterparts already well-established in the industry.




