EVENTS

Annual Conference: April 10-12, 2018 at the Kona Kai Resort, San Diego

Each chapter may send 2 attendees for free! Up to 4 more students may attend for \$100/ea. Discounted pricing available for more than 6 attendees from a chapter if required. Students will be asked to volunteer for 1-2hrs during the conference.

Dinner Meetings: Students may attend any CalGeo dinner meeting for only \$20.

Emerging Professional Meetings: CalGeo will be hosting informal EP meetings in California with live speakers or with a live-broadcast from the Sacramento meeting. Attendance is free!

Awards and Scholarships

At CalGeo's Annual Conference each year, Student Chapters are selected to receive various awards recognizing them for their involvement and effort during the year. Please keep these awards in mind as you plan activities and events during the year.

BEST POSTER \$250 + award

To be in contention, the student chapter must create and present a poster at the conference. Posters will be scored and judged at the conference where they will be on display to conference attendees. Questions should be directed to Mr. Neal Berliner (berliner@geoconinc.com).

The poster should present current information about the student chapter, including current officers, a group photograph, social activities, sponsors, various pictures of events, including speakers, field trips, competitions and mentoring activities, as well as a large school and CalGeo logo. The Student Outreach Committee will assess each poster. There will be one award only.

PLEASE BRING AN EASEL FOR YOUR POSTER DISPLAY!

Poster scoring:

- 10% Student Chapter Board of Director information, including year chapter was established.
- 10% Student Chapter Group Photo
- 10% Speakers & Photos
- 20% Field trips – construction sites, research facilities, historical engr sites
- 10% Recognition of Sponsors
- 10% Social events
- 10% Regional/National competitions/events
- 10% Mentoring activities (inspiring Elem/ Jr. High / High School Students)
- 10% Bringing an Easel for Poster Display at Conference



It is also requested that all graduating students in the CalGeo chapter prepare a resume (2 page max in PDF format) that can be included and distributed with our conference materials. Please include all resumes in a single pdf file and email to Mr. Neal Berliner (berliner@geoconinc.com).

MOST ACTIVE CHAPTER \$500 + award

To be in contention, the student chapter must to submit a detailed summary report of the year's activities in PDF format, to Mr. Neal Berliner (berliner@geoconinc.com) by March 25, 2019.

The report should address the items identified in the guidelines below, and should include photos of various student activities. A poster should also be created for display at the conference. The report should be in PDF format. The Student Outreach Committee will then assess and score the reports based on the total accomplishments. There will be one award.

Please note that while it is encouraged that CalGeo interact with and attend meetings hosted by other clubs, the scoring for this award will be based on events and activities planned and hosted by the CalGeo student chapter.

Most Active Chapter Award guidelines:

- 10% Membership/attendance /growth
- 20% Speakers
- 20% Field trips – construction sites, research facilities, historical engr sites
- 20% Social Events
- 10% National Competitions/Events (Geo-Institute), successful entries/awards
- 10% Mentoring activities (inspiring Elem/ Jr. High / High School Students)
- 10% Poster session

RISING STAR \$500 + award

This award is for our newest student chapters that have been established for less than 3 years. To be in contention, the student chapter must submit a detailed summary of the year's activities to their CalGeo liaison and Mr. Neal Berliner (berliner@geoconinc.com) by March 25, 2019.

The report should address the items identified in the guidelines below, and should include photos of various student activities. A poster should also be created for display at the conference. The report should be in PDF format. The Student Outreach Committee will then assess based on the total accomplishments. There will be one award.

Rising Star Award guidelines:

- 20% Membership/attendance/growth
- 20% Speakers
- 20% Field trips – construction sites, research facilities, historical engr sites
- 5% Social events
- 15% National competitions/events (Geo-Institute), successful entries/awards
- 10% Mentoring activities (inspiring Elem/ Jr. High / High School Students)
- 10% Poster session
