CalGeo at UCLA was founded ten years ago with one driving principle in mind: to promote geotechnical engineering within the student body and to increase exposure in the field. This goal still lives in our club today, and we strive to achieve it through informational and engaging events such as field trips, speaker events, and networking opportunities.

Field Trips

We offer countless field trips related to geotechnical engineering to showcase how the work environment is like in the field. These are first-hand opportunities for UCLA students to observe CPT and SPT testing, tour active project sites, and visit engineering firms in the local LA area.

Students also gain insight by talking to experienced superintendents and company personnel, allowing them to ask questions, seek advice, and delve into the more nuanced issues that may come up during work. As the demand for these field trips is often high, we do our best to provide accommodation to all students that want to attend, such as transportation and PPE.





GeoExpo

Our biggest event of the year is GeoExpo—although last academic year's event was unfortunately canceled, our last GeoExpo hosted in 2019 was attended by a record-setting 71 guests. Over half of these guests were members outside UCLA. The aim of this event is to create an avenue for networking and conversation amongst students, professors, and industry professionals.

These conversations take place in numerous forms: students are given the rare opportunity to attend speaker events on the latest trends in industry, and both undergrads and graduates can showcase their research in poster sessions. While serving as a celebration of a year's effort, GeoExpo truly embodies our motto of bridging the gap between academia, industry, and students.

Speaker Sessions

In addition to field trips, we also hold professional speaker events throughout the year, during which students learn about topics ranging from work experience and career advice to the general state of geotechnical engineering and the future of the field. This past year, we welcomed Ken Hudson to talk about the daily challenges faced in the field as well as underground, in metro extension projects.

We were also very happy to host the Army Corp of Engineers to to talk about dam safety. These talks give crucial insight into how challenging yet rewarding the geotechnical realm can be as well as a glimpse into how passionate these speakers are for their work.

Rooftop Barbecue

CalGeo at UCLA holds an annual Fall Barbeque with the goal of strengthening the bonds within the UCLA geotechnical community. People from many different disciplines gather to enjoy a nice barbequed meal, including but not limited to geotechnical engineering professors, industry representatives, alumni, and graduate and undergraduate students. Last year, over 35 guests came to the event.






GeoWall is a competitive project where students design and build a soil-nail earth retaining wall using kraft paper and poster board. The goal is to design the retaining wall with the least weight of kraft paper reinforcement strips within an allotted construction time and submit a design report detailing the methods behind their final design.

The UCLA GeoWall team has qualified for the national competition every year since their inception. In the past two years, they have placed 3rd and 4th in their annual national competition held at GeoCongress placing 1st in design report in both years while also placing 2nd and 1st in their regional competition in the Pacific Southwest Conference. By encouraging a welcoming environment, we provide our members with a way to learn about geotechnical concepts in a hands-on environment and to apply what they learn in class to solve real-world geotechnical problems.





We have carefully planned our budget to deliver the best experience possible for our members and contributors, especially given the unconventional circumstances. We understand that some of our budget is tentative, but we have also accounted for in-person events based on the hopes that situations continue to improve.
